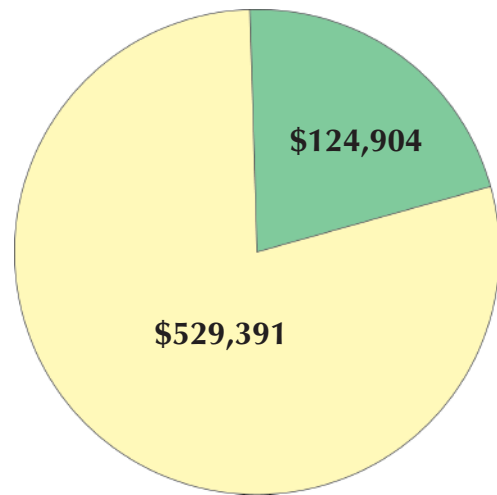

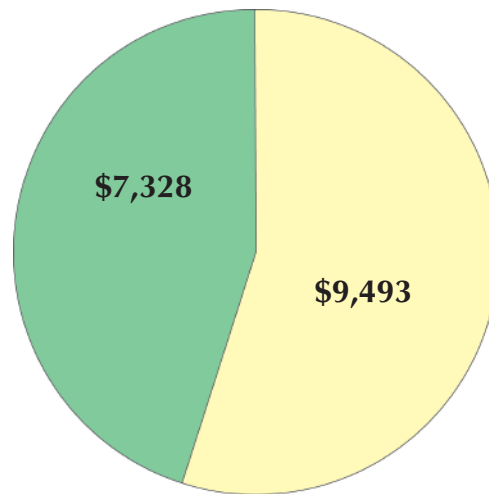

The following charts provide an overview of the level of benevolent care provided by Cumberland Crossings, a Diakon Lutheran Senior Living Community in Carlisle, Pa., in 2010, as well as contributions to the senior living community and their uses.

2010 Contribution Use at Cumberland: \$16,821



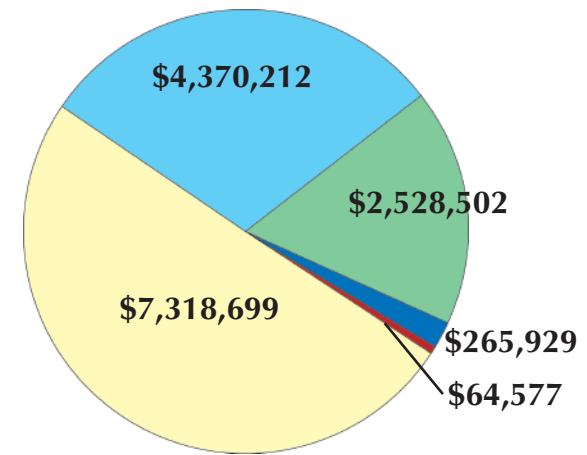

Capital Improvements: In 2010, Diakon Lutheran Social Ministries spent \$11.549 million on capital improvements and expansion at its senior living communities. Of that total, \$882,539 was expended at Cumberland Crossings.
