Robinwood offers many activities

In April, Robinwood began an intergenerational program involving pre-K and kindergartners from Hagerstown Community College Daycare, which will continue the first Wednesday of each month for the rest of the year.

An oil and acrylic painting class began in April, instructed by E. McCafferty from Hagerstown Community College.

Other workshops scheduled through May and June were historically accurate doll and presidential review of George Washington, John Adams, Thomas Jefferson, Abraham Lincoln and Harry Truman.

Cynthia Lawrence-Fink, noted historical dollmaker, discussed dolls dating from pre-history to the latter part of the 18th century, followed by an in-depth discussion of handmade dolls in American from the late 18th and 19th centuries. Examples were on display.
