Transportation Guidelines

- Participants will be asked wellness questions prior to entering transport vehicles before being transported to and from the program. If it is determined that youth have exhibited symptoms of illness, the youth will not be permitted to be transported to or from the program and established COVID Protocols will be followed.
- In the event that a participant becomes ill while on campus, they will be given a face covering to wear, and follow the established COVID protocols, and arrangements will be made for that participant to be transported home. A wellness notification will be sent to the referring agency as well as parents/guardians of all youth that may have been exposed to the symptomatic participant.
- Participants will be required to have their temperature taken, sanitize hands, and wear a face covering prior to vehicle entry.
- Program staff members and participants will be required to wear a face covering throughout the duration of all transports.
- Transport vehicles will be utilized at 80% capacity to ensure that participants have ample space when being transported. Seating in vehicles will be arranged with consideration for social distancing

On Campus Activity Guidelines

- Face coverings will be required for all staff & students while participating in indoor (classrooms, counseling sessions, circles etc.) on campus programming. Face covering breaks will be planned into scheduled activities throughout the day to allow students (and staff) to social distance outdoors and remove masks temporarily. When eating, staff and students may remove face coverings during these times as long as they are seated at least 6 feet from other staff and students.
- When possible, group activities will be conducted in the outdoor setting. During outdoor programming, social distancing recommendation will be followed and face coverings will be optional.
- Staff are permitted to remove face coverings when they are able to social isolate indoors (for example, sitting in their office isolated from others)
- Peer groups will function at no more than 60% capacity.

- Academics Student Groups and Programming Student Groups and assigned staffing will not intermingle during programming day. This includes meals and recreation times.
- Adventure based program will be conducted on campus only or local locations in which distancing guidelines can be followed.

Visitor Guidelines

- Must have called ahead and scheduled an appointment
- Must report to the admin building upon arrival on campus and must wash hands or use hand-sanitizer immediately upon entering the building
- Must wear a face covering when interacting with staff –or- students or are in a building
- Must sign in and sign out
- Are not allowed on campus if they have symptoms below
 - Cough
 - Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
 - Or are you experiencing any of the following symptoms:
 - Fever
 - Chills
 - Repeated shaking with chills
 - Muscle pain
 - Headache
 - Sore throat
 - Any new loss of taste or smell

Wellness Guidelines

- Hand sanitizing stations will be positioned throughout the DWC campus with all groups being required to utilize the stations following each activity.
- Students will be coached and reminded to maintain appropriate hygiene and social distancing throughout program day.
- Students should report any change in their medical condition if they develop any COVID related wellness issues
